



“Winter Morning”, Cameron McIntyre

Cameron McIntyre was born in Beaufort, S.C. in November 1968. Formally trained in life drawing, figure and landscape painting at the University of South Carolina, and the Gibbes museum of Art in Charleston, S.C. Cameron has been painting for nearly 20 years. His tonalist impressionist landscapes reflect his love for color, sparse design, and the peacefulness of the pristine environment surrounding his farm on the Eastern Shore of Virginia where he lives and works. His paintings are currently represented by Newman Galleries of Philadelphia.

Winter Morning is a richly colored tonal scene that captures the essence of the pines and marshes of the Eastern Shore. The painting measures 18” by 18” and is framed with a hand made gold leaf frame by Waller Picture Framing of Middleburg, Virginia.
